



ASPS New Defibrillator

Mr Ashworth recently completed a marathon in Geneva, Switzerland with his friends to raise money to purchase two defibrillators. Thanks to their incredible efforts, they raised £1,188 - enough to place one

defibrillator at Mr Ashworth's previous school in Cardiff and install the other right here at our brilliant school, All Saints. Defibrillators are life-saving devices that give a high energy shock to the heart of someone who is in cardiac arrest.

Our defibrillator has been registered on *The Circuit*, the national defibrillator network that helps emergency services locate the nearest device in an emergency. It is securely stored on site, ready for use should it ever be needed. We thank Mr Ashworth and his friends for providing our school and community with this potentially life saving device.

End of Year Books

We would like to inform parents and carers of an update to our usual end-of-year arrangements regarding pupil exercise books. This year, all pupil books will be retained in school for our records. Maintaining these books enables us to carefully monitor progress, support curriculum planning, and reflect on the learning journey of each class over the year.


