A real highlight of the morning was meeting the Mayor of the Vale of Glamorgan, who arrived wearing the ceremonial chain of office. The Mayor spoke to the children about her role, responsibilities and day-to-day work, giving pupils a valuable insight into local democracy in action. Our pupils impressed everyone with their thoughtful, pre-prepared questions and their confident engagement throughout.

The formal setting of the chamber provided the perfect backdrop for a lively debate. Pupils spoke passionately on both sides, presenting clear arguments and responding respectfully to one another's points. They particularly loved seeing their name and live image displayed on the large screen when they pressed their mic to speak — it truly made them feel like real councillors!
