Our work this term will include...

Mathematics & Numeracy – We will be developing our understanding of statistics by reading and creating different types of graphs, as well as exploring money, time, angles, position and direction. Learners will also take part in a range of problem-solving and numerical reasoning activities linked to real-life contexts.

Languages, Literacy & Communication – We will be exploring instruction writing and creating our own WW2 recipes, as well as studying poetry and persuasive writing linked to our topic. In Welsh, we will focus on speaking and responding to questions such as *Faint ydy dy oed di?*, *Pwy sy'n ___ oed?*, *Sut mae'n tywydd heddiw?* and *Faint ydy hwn?*

Humanities – Our topic this term is **WW2 and Barry**, where we will explore key historical questions about the war, evacuees, life on the home front and how Barry was affected. Learners will investigate their own questions about WW2, developing curiosity, research skills and an understanding of how the past has shaped our community.

Health & Wellbeing – In PE, we will be developing our athletic skills in Summer 1 as we prepare for Sports Day, followed by rounders in Summer 2. Through our Jigsaw scheme, we will explore diversity, inclusion, relationships and the “Changing Me” unit.

Science & Technology – We will link our science learning to WW2 by exploring materials, forces and light, thinking about how these ideas connect to shelters, vehicles and communication during the war. Learners will also develop their digital skills through research, simple data handling and presenting information linked to our topic.

Expressive Arts - Learners will create artwork inspired by WW2, including propaganda posters, wartime scenes and evacuee sketches.

RVE – In Summer 1, we will explore the Gospel question “*What kind of world did Jesus want?*” through stories and teachings from the New Testament. In Summer 2, we will learn about values from multi-faith and no-faith perspectives, thinking about what guides people’s choices.

Our school value for Summer 1 is **Service**, and for Summer 2 is **Hope**, which will be woven through assemblies, class discussions and daily routines.



How you can help your child at home...

- Read regularly together to build confidence, vocabulary and comprehension. Ask simple questions about the story and talk about any new words you come across.
- Talk about our topic: WW2 — chat about what life was like in Barry during the war, such as air-raided shelters, evacuees arriving in the town, rationing in local shops, and how people helped each other. This helps children make real-life links to their own community.
- Chat about age-appropriate current news to develop curiosity, understanding and language skills.
- Practise times tables little and often, using quick-fire questions, games or Doodle Tables to build fluency.
- Use Doodle (Maths, English, Tables & Spellings) for short, regular sessions throughout the v
- Try quick mental-maths moments during daily routines (number bonds, doubles, halves, quick addition/subtraction) and practise telling the time using both analogue and digital clocks.
- Support weekly spellings, sent home on a Monday.
- Talk openly about feelings to help children name emotions and develop resilience and wellbeing.
